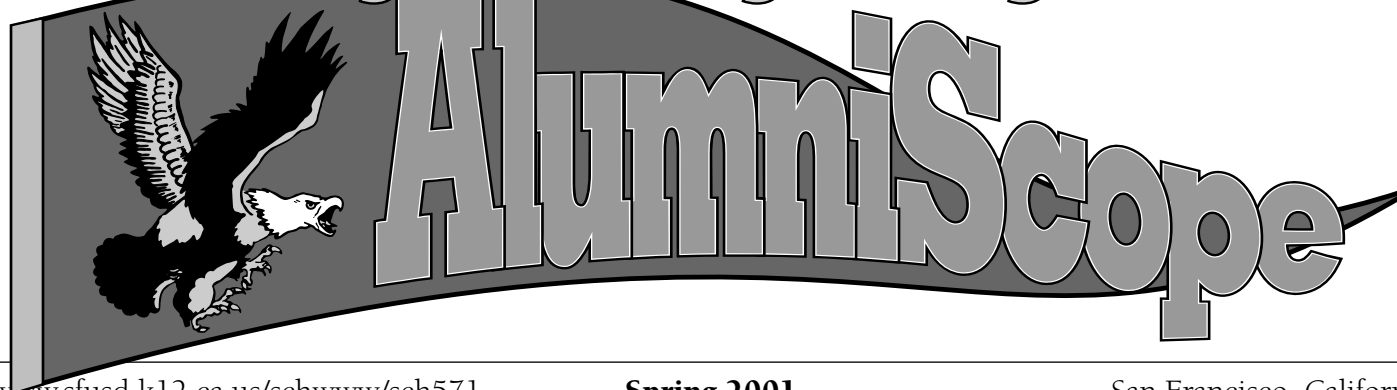

Scholarships and Awards

With the exception of the Permanent Endowment, Principal's Fund and Meyskens Award, these awards are given on an annual basis to college-bound graduating seniors. Scholarship recipients are selected by departmental committees or by members of the GWHS Alumni Board of Directors.

Robert Donovan Scholarship Fund: Named after a faculty member, this \$250 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student in either Foreign Language, Social Studies, or Music.

Permanent Endowment: Contributions designated for this fund are what allows our overall monies to grow. The interest generated from this fund allows us to give Teacher Grants.

WWII Memorial Scholarship: This \$500 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding ROTC student planning on a career in the military.

Israel Study Grant: Two students are selected each school year to participate in a travel to Israel program.

Mary Marshall Scholarship: This \$100 scholarship established to honor a faculty member is awarded to an outstanding Art student for use towards the purchase of art supplies.

Melvin C. Hanson Art Scholarship: Established by the Hanson family in honor of their son, a GWHS student, this \$250 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding Art student who specializes in the area of painting.

Edith Garin Scholarship: Named after a faculty member, this \$500 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student based on GPA, service to the school, and financial need.

Saul Madfes Scholarship: This \$50 scholarship established to honor a faculty member and principal, and is awarded to an outstanding student athlete/scholar.

John Soares Scholarship: Named after a faculty member, this \$100 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding Art student.

Principal's Fund: To be used by the principal for special projects at the request of the principal with approval of the Alumni Board.

Ruth Adams Scholarship: Established to honor a principal, this \$50 scholarship is awarded to an outstanding student based on GPA and service to the school.

Jerry Shilgi Scholarship: This \$1,000 scholarship was established by the Shilgi family in honor of their son, a GWHS student, and is awarded to an outstanding student in the field of Instrumental Music.

George Choppelas Forensic/Debate Award: This \$500 scholarship was established by Thornton O'Glove in honor of a fellow classmate and is awarded to the top debate student.

Meyskens Family Teacher Enhancement Award: This award was established by Frank Meyskens in honor of Merton Jones, Kenneth Irwin and Harry Redlick, faculty members, and provides \$2,000 to a current faculty member to be used for a summer study program.

RFD/Garin Scholarship: This scholarship was established as an adjunct to the Garin Scholarship and will enable the selection of one additional recipient of a Garin Scholarship.

New Fund to Honor Athletic Coaches

The Washington Alumni Association is pleased to announce the creation of an Athletic Coaches Appreciation Fund. This fund will enable the Washington community and alumni to make donations in honor of a specific coach, or in appreciation of their athletic experience at Washington.

According to Susan Saunders, current athletic director, funding for the athletic program has decreased significantly over the past five years. For the 2000-01 school year the athletic program received only \$8,000 from the school district to fund 22 athletic teams! It costs \$35,000 per year to maintain a quality athletic program at GWHS, and two-thirds of this cost comes from soda machine profits and numerous direct



donations. Needless to say, it's time for the Washington community to step forward and help maintain our athletic program.

The money generated from this new fund will go towards "big ticket" athletic items such as wrestling mats, uniforms, and helmets. These items are very expensive and can eat up a large portion of the existing athletic budget. Many teams have not been able to purchase new uniforms in five years and many teams have resorted to fundraising and asking student athletes to pay a portion of the cost of these items, which should be paid for by the athletic budget.

Our current coaching staff does an excellent job with their individual team fundraising efforts and are well aware of the current budget situation. They have agreed to promote the Athletic Coaches Appreciation Fund and solicit donations. So we say: **Dare To Soar With The Eagles!**
