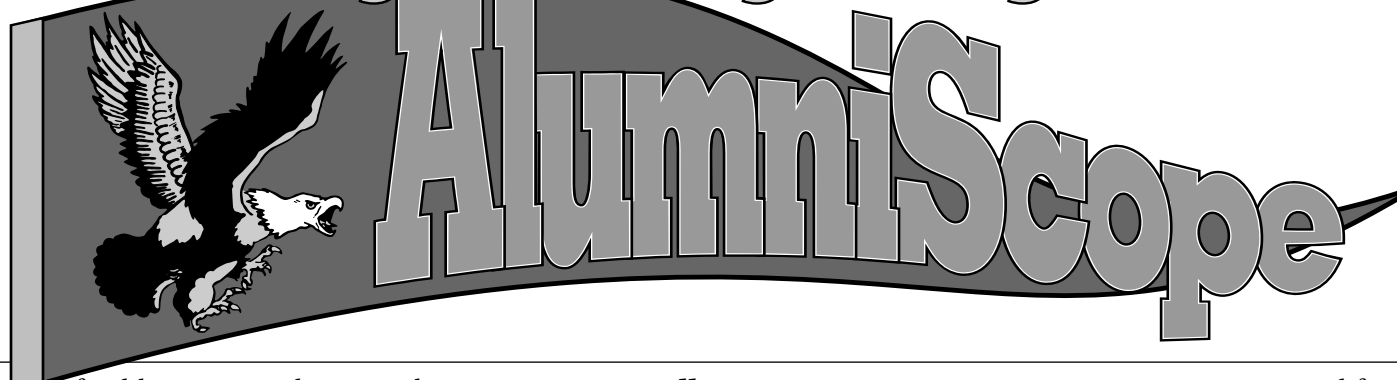

## Hall of Merit Induction and Class of 2001 Scholarship Awards

On June 5, 2001, the GWHS Alumni Association participated in the Senior Awards Ceremony at which almost \$10,000 in scholarship awards were given to seniors in the Class of 2001. The funds that you, our membership, donate so generously during the year are the same funds that go to our students. All of these young people are college bound, good students, active in and out of school in a variety of activities. Many are working and many volunteer their time in different community-based organizations. We all thank you very much!

At this Senior Assembly we also honored our 2000–01 Hall of Merit inductee, **Phil Smith S'70**. Phil lettered in basketball and football at GWHS and went on to USF where he was an All-American basketball player. He was a three-time league champ and the ninth all-time scorer at USF. He played professional basketball for nine seasons, playing his rookie year on the Golden State Warriors' championship team of 1974–75.

We were very pleased to have Phil and his family with us at the Ceremony where Board President John Rothmann present-

ed him with a plaque commemorating his Hall of Merit induction.

It is our pleasure to announce the 2000–2001 Scholarship Awards:

**Edith Garin Scholarship Award** of \$500 was shared by Shirley Duong and Annisa Kau. This award is given to the outstanding student(s) based on GPA, service to the school and financial need.

**The Dr. Tom Richards Award** of \$250 was given to Marina Shmukler.

**The Saul Madfes Athlete/Scholar Award** of \$250 was shared by Luis Garcia and Erin Donohue. This scholarship was established to honor our past principal and is awarded to an outstanding student/athlete/scholar.

**The Ruth Adams Cup Award** of \$50 was shared by Richard Aquirre, Shirley Duong, Cary Lynn Tom and Kara L. Woo.

**The Ann Rhine Award** of \$500 was given to Brian Fujimoto.

**The Class of '85 Most Improved Student Award** of \$500 was shared by Jeremikio Barlow and Jasmine Loy.

**The Choppelas Forensics Award** of \$500 was shared by Mark Lowe and William Chiu. This scholarship is given in honor of retired Judge George Choppelas and established by Thornton O'Glove (both former students) to outstanding students in the Forensics and Debate.

**The Robert Hilmoe Award** of \$250 was given to Colleen Ng. This scholarship is given in honor of this former teacher and is given to college-bound English Department students.

## New Scholarships Created

In the Spring 2001 issue, we informed you of the passing of Joan Monte who had been a member of the GWHS Counseling Department for many years.

Joan was the College Counselor for most of the time she spent at GWHS and students felt most grateful to her for the work she did on their behalf which resulted in acceptances from colleges all over the country. The San Francisco Board of Education resolution, sponsored by Commissioner Frank Chong, to re-name the GWHS boys' gymnasium floor Athanasopoulos Court passed unanimously to a standing ovation at the April 24, 2001, Board meeting, according to Larry Yee, Boys' Varsity Basketball Coach.

The next step is to paint "Coach A's Court" on the gym floor and hold a ceremony to commemorate this dedication,

## GWHS Alumni are New Members of S.F. Prep Hall of Fame

Two illustrious GWHS alumni were recently inducted into the San Francisco Prep Hall of Fame: **John "Sid" Phelan**, GWHS Head Basketball Coach from 1947 to 1954. Under his coaching, GWHS won championships in all four divisions. The 1952 squad was runner-up in the Tournament of Championships clash. Sid is the founder of the California Community Colleges Basketball Coaches Association.

Prior to his teaching/coaching career, Phelan was a member of the SFPD and during those years was on leave of absence from the US Navy and rising to the rank of Lt. Commander.

The second honoree is **Jerome "Jerry" White, S'70**. Jerry was a four-sports star for GWHS. For three seasons he was a starter on the football team playing both offense and defense. He was 2nd-team All-Academic Athletic Association in

1969. He also competed in track, in the long jump, 100 and 220 yard dashes and relays, and ran on the cross country team; but it was in baseball that Jerry was not only successful as a AAA star, but found his future vocation. He was a first-team All-AAA as an outfielder and starred in the East/West All-Star Game.

Jerry broke into Major League Baseball in 1974 with the Montreal Expos and was an outfielder for 12 years with the Expos, Chicago Cubs and St. Louis Cardinals. He began a career in coaching with the Expos in 1986 and has been the first base coach for the Minnesota Twins since 1993.

Jerry's other honors include induction in the GWHS Hall of Merit, where his jersey (No. 18) is retired; and the Montreal Chamber of Commerce, which bestowed him with the Outstanding Citizen of 1982 award.
