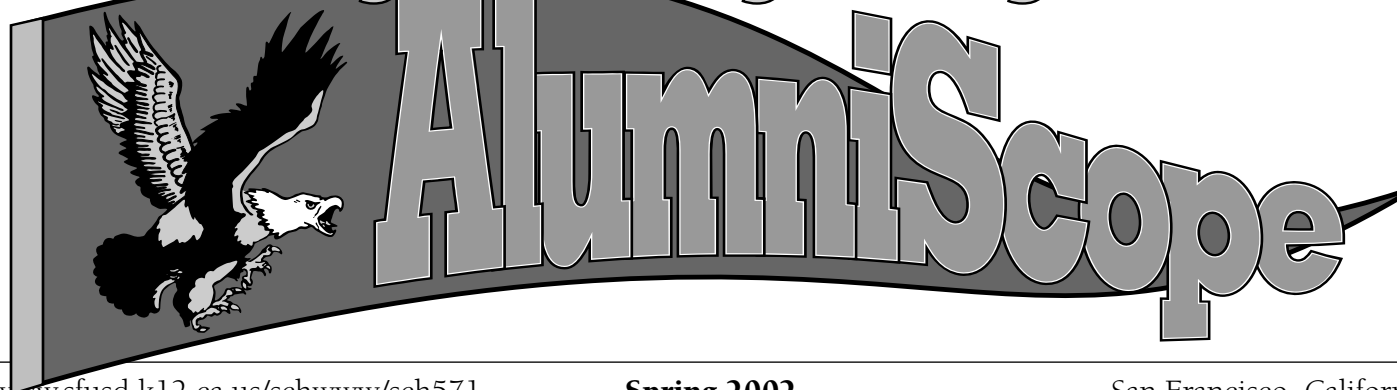

Stanley Burford S'60, one of GWHS' first mascots, now best known as television and radio traffic reporter for KGO's ABC-TV affiliate Channel 7 and KGO radio. Stan's outstanding record in broadcasting began with his groundbreaking work as a helicopter-based solo traffic reporter with KSFO in the early 1960s. After 35 years in the field, Stan still gets in the air to provide helicopter traffic reports for the morning commute before anchoring the afternoon commute reports in the studio. Between his gigs at KSFO and KGO, he held directorial and managerial positions for several television stations in the Bay Area and elsewhere as well as the Disney Channel. Stan has also authored *Rush Hour Relief: A Guide to Alternate Routes in Northern California*. His work in TV and radio

has earned him many awards including 14 Emmy citations and 11 Emmy nominations.

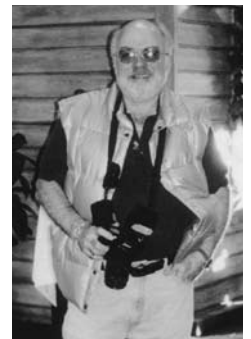
